


Queuing Theory: The Problems With Waiting

- 1. We get bored when we wait
- 2. We are uncertain of how long we'll have to wait
- 3. We feel a sense of injustice when someone who has waited less time is served first



The Elements of the Parable:

- The Ten Virgins = Potential followers of Jesus

- The Wedding = The fully established Kingdom of Heaven
