

3. What was a situation when you needed someone to intervene to rescue you?



## **Digging Deeper**

4. This Herod is the nephew of the Herod who ruled in Jesus' day. What can we learn about his character in verses 20-23?

8. Why would it be possible for Peter to be able to be at such peace while sleeping in the jail? What promises has God given us? (Psalm 4:8; Isaiah 41:10)

5. Why would Herod's choice to arrest Peter in verses 2-4 please the Jewish leaders? Why should Herod, as a Roman official, join in the Jewish opposition to the church?

9. How does prayer play such a prominent role in this account? What are some other Scripture passages where prayer is emphasized?

6. What could be said about the fact that God saved Peter but not James? We may not understand God's ways, but what do we know about God's sovereign will?

10. What is your take on what happened when Rhoda came to the gate and saw Peter? How did everyone respond when God actually answered their prayers? Why was Peter's release such a big surprise?
