
12. When has your faith run into conflict with our government or our laws?

Getting Started

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling?

2. What was something that took you a long time to be persuaded to believe? Who was the person who convinced you the most?

3. What resources have you used to prove something to someone else? Are you a good persuader? Do people usually believe what you have to say or are people often dismissive of your ideas?



Digging Deeper

4. In verse 1, after passing through Amphipolis and Apollonia they came to the capital city of Thessalonica. How were Paul and his companions received there? (1 Thessalonians 1:4-10; 3:1-4)

8. Since Paul's conversion, this is the sixth time Paul had been forced to leave a city because of persecution. How would you have responded to such negative responses from the people you were trying to reach? How did Paul respond? (1 Thessalonians 2:1-12)

5. In verses 2-4 what three ways did Paul use to explain who Jesus was? What else could he have done to be more convincing?

9. Compared to the Thessalonians in verses 2-4, how did the Bereans receive the Gospel in verses 11-12? What made the Bereans "more noble" than the Thessalonians?

6. Paul and Silas spent three sabbaths with the Thessalonians. Over that time what Old Testament scriptures could they have used to prove that Jesus was the Christ?

10. Why is it so important to examine what is taught in the church in light of the Scriptures? What is at stake if we aren't good "Bereans"?

7. What accusations had Paul encountered previously? (Acts 16:20-21) What accusations were being made in this passage? (V5-7) What was behind all these things that people brought against Paul and his fellow missionaries?

11. What stands out to you more than anything else in this particular passage? Why is it so meaningful to you?
